When Barry Callebaut opened its new, 60,000 square-meter global distribution center in Belgium, the building earned the title of Earth's largest chocolate warehouse.

To protect the structural elements of the massive facility, the assets within it and to reduce accident risks to employees, it was essential to find protective barriers that did not limit the efficiency and flow of the warehouse. After an in-depth survey, A-SAFE identified a range of fit-to-purpose safety solutions to protect the infrastructure, assets and, most importantly, the chocolatier's employees.

This included adding iFlex Bollards, Height Restrictors, and eFlex Pedestrian 3 Rail Barriers. Then to protect the site's 125,000 pallet spaces, iFlex Single RackEnd Barriers, which are designed to defend against impact damage to racking, were also installed. All these barriers are made to withstand impacts without causing structural damage to the concrete flooring and generally maintaining the structure of the new facility.

With these installations, the risk of accidents and site damage has been greatly reduced, enhancing Barry Callebaut's reputation for safety and employee care while saving money and time on repairs.
